
Dressed for the New Idea of Success: Carlos Campos, David Hart, Lucio Castro



More promising, though, were efforts by designers like the talented Honduras-born <u>Carlos Campos</u> to locate a middle ground between traditional tailoring techniques and a naturally evolving style idiom formed from elements of both sportswear and the street. Graphically arresting, its patterns drawing inspiration from street drawings by the Spanish post-graffiti artist Eltono, Mr. Campos's collection of neoprene bombers and short-pants suits was reminiscent of recent efforts by the Milan-based designer <u>Neil Barrett</u> — but with a bit more humor or, at least, less of Mr. Barrett's chilly rigor.
